When a Marine is Wounded, ill or injured (WII), their bills don't stop - and neither should their pay. The Wounded Warrior Regiment (WWR) aims to ensure WII Marines get all the benefits to which they are entitled. While working to return to duty or leave the service and return to their civilian community, they may be entitled to the following pay and allowances in addition to their basic pay:

BASIC ALLOWANCE FOR SUBSISTENCE (BAS)

BAS entitlement continues for service members while hospitalized. When you become an outpatient, you will continue to receive BAS as long as you are not issued a meal card to eat in a military dining facility.

BASIC ALLOWANCE FOR HOUSING (BAH)

You will continue receiving BAH throughout your medical treatment based on your dependency status and your permanent duty station. It will not change or terminate while you are being treated in a Military Treatment Facility (MTF) unless you receive Permanent Change of Station (PCS) orders.

FAMILY SEPARATION ALLOWANCE (FSA)

If you were receiving FSA while deployed and were then sent to a medical facility for treatment in a location other than your permanent duty station, you may continue to be paid FSA unless all your dependents come to stay at your location. Contact the local pay office for more information.

PAY AND ALLOWANCE CONTINUATION (PAC)

WII Marines hospitalized for treatment from a wound, illness, or injury received in a combat zone, hostile fire area, or from being exposed to a hostile fire event, will continue to receive some of the pay and allowances they were getting when wounded, injured, or became ill.



Additional Entitlements

TRAUMATIC SERVICEMEMBERS' GROUP LIFE INSURANCE (TSGLI)

The TSGLI program provides emergency financial assistance to recovering Service members who suffer severe traumatic injuries, both on or off duty. Qualifying traumatic injuries are those resulting from external force or violence or a condition that can be linked to a traumatic event. TSGLI payments are a one-time, tax-free, lump sum payment per traumatic event; it is not on-going income replacement. The amount you would receive depends on your injury.

INCAPACITATION PAY (RESERVES)

A WII Reservist who is unable to perform military duties, due to an injury, illness, or disease incurred or aggravated in the line of duty is entitled to full pay and allowances, including all incentive and special pays to which entitled, if otherwise eligible, less any earned income.

CASUAL PAY (CP)

Casual Pay is a special payment to cover incidental costs that arise during treatment (including clothing needs). The casual pay is considered an advance on the member's subsequent paycheck and must be paid back.

INVITATIONAL TRAVEL ORDERS / NON-MEDICAL ASSISTANT ORDERS

ITOs and NMA orders are government funded orders that reimburse travel expenses for family or caregivers. ITOs authorize up to three individuals to travel to the bedside of an in-patient WII Marine. NMA orders authorize travel for at least one individual to assist with the activities of daily living for an in- or out-patient WII Marine. Expenses that may be covered are travel to and from the hospital, incidental expenses, and Per Diem (lodging expenses and meals paid at the location's daily rate).

SPECIAL COMPENSATION FOR ASSISTANCE WITH ACTIVITIES OF DAILY LIFE (SCAADL)

SCAADL is special monthly compensation for WII Marines who incur a permanent catastrophic injury or illness. SCAADL helps offset the loss of income of a primary caregiver providing non-medical care, support, and assistance for the WII Marine.



THE WOUNDED WARRIOR REGIMENT

The Wounded Warrior Regiment (WWR) stood up in April 2007 and immediately began to assume responsibilities for non-medical Wounded Warrior care. **The mission of the WWR is to provide and facilitate assistance to Wounded, Ill and Injured (WII) Marines, Sailors attached to or in direct support of Marine units, and their family members, throughout the phases of recovery.** The Regimental Headquarters element, located in Quantico, Va., coordinates the operations of two Wounded Warrior Battalions located at Camp Pendleton, Calif., and Camp Lejeune, N.C. The Regimental Headquarters provides unity of command and unity of effort through a single Commander who provides guidance, direction, and oversight to the Marine Corps WII non-medical care process and ensures continuous improvements to care management and the seamless transition of recovering Marines.
