FUTURE PLANNING AND ASSESSMENTS FACT SHEET

THE WOUNDED WARRIOR REGIMENT (WWR) HAS A UNIQUE CELL—THE FUTURE INITIATIVES AND TRANSFORMATION TEAM (FITT)—that was installed to assess current capabilities and develop future programs to meet the WWR’s emerging requirements. The FITT has two components: future planning and assessments.

At the heart of the future planning mission is a requirement to ensure WWR programs and resources effectively posture our Wounded, Ill, and Injured (WII) Marines and their families for success—at all stages of care and whether they return to active duty or reintegrate to their communities. FITT future planning initiatives include exploring the future of WII care by interviewing and collaborating with leading subject matter experts from government, private industry, and non-profit organizations. This collaboration helps to anticipate and address the needs of the WII population.

The WWR places a high value on the views and experiences of our WII Marines and their families and strives to sustain multiple methods of feedback, as the voices of those we serve directly impact our decision-making process and allow us to improve programs and services and appropriately direct resources. The Assessment Cell is in place to provide the WWR objective data to appropriately inform decisions and actions.

THE WOUNDED WARRIOR REGIMENT

The Wounded Warrior Regiment (WWR) stood up in April 2007 and immediately began to assume responsibilities for non-medical Wounded Warrior care. **The mission of the WWR is to provide and facilitate assistance to WII Marines, Sailors attached to or in direct support of Marine units, and their family members, throughout the phases of recovery.** The Regimental Headquarters element, located in Quantico, Virginia, coordinates the operations of two Wounded Warrior Battalions located at Camp Pendleton, California, and Camp Lejeune, North Carolina. The Regimental Headquarters provides unity of command and unity of effort through a single Commander who provides guidance, direction, and oversight to the Marine Corps WII non-medical care process and ensures continuous improvements to care management and the seamless transition of recovering Marines.
