



2010 WARRIOR GAMES GENERAL RULES

- Awards
 - Best individual performances in each event (1st, 2nd and 3rd)
 - Best overall (cumulative) performances by each platoon
 - Winners will be decided by combining individual performances in each event to create a cumulative total
 - Best overall performances by branch of service
 - A factoring formula will be created to decide branch of service winners (platoon performances will be included in the formula)
- Paralympians (those who have competed at a Paralympic Games) or Elite/National team service members past or present or anyone who has competed internationally for US Paralympics are NOT eligible for the Warrior Games
- Each platoon is allowed the following representatives from each disability group – below is the participant range for each disability group
 - 5 - 9 Upper Body Impairments
 - 5 - 9 Lower Body Impairments
 - 2 - 5 SCI – Spinal Cord Injuries (Severe Back Injuries)
 - 3 - 5 Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI)/Stroke/Cerebral Palsy (CP)
 - 2 - 4 PTSD
- Participants may compete in a maximum of three 3 individual events but must sign up for a minimum of **two (2) individual events** not including team sports. Ultimately, the Service will determine which events the participant will compete based on the registration form.
- No more than **two (2) competitors per platoon per event**
Example: Marine Red Platoon can only have 2 competitors entered in the upper body impairment division of the 100M sprint event
- Each platoon is allowed a maximum of 25 members and 5 alternates – the 5 alternates should be a range of disabilities - paper work for the

alternates is due the same time as the 25 member roster (Only 25 athletes per platoon will be allowed to attend)

- Platoons are recommended to have a minimum of 20 on their roster
- No CHANGES to platoon rosters after April 19, 2010
- Maximum of three 3 Ultimate Warriors from each platoon – (no minimum number)
- If there are discrepancies or questions of disability and categories from the registration form and/or upon visualization, US Paralympics National Team Coaches and Meet Directors will determine which category an athlete will compete in. (i.e. if a participant has a lower and upper body disability the more severe area of the two injuries will be used to determine the competition category).
- Meet Directors have the decision making power to combine disability categories if there is not enough participation in a certain event. Meet Directors also have the ability to cancel an event if there are not enough participants in that particular event (see Event Cancellation Policy)
- Event Cancellation Policy: In case of an event cancellation due to lack of participants, the participant will be notified that they have been moved to their 1st alternate choice if the 1st alternate choice is closed they will then be assigned to the 2nd alternate choice
- Each Warrior Games Platoon will enter a sitting volleyball team (see event rules)
- Platoon Colors/Uniforms:
 - *A uniform of 1 long sleeve dri-fit t-shirt, 1 short sleeve dri-fit t-shirt, 1 pair of black shorts and one warm top and bottom will be provided to each participant.
